Windu is an UNIQUE RECORDER QUARTET
which combines CLASSICAL AND
CONTEMPORARY REPERTOIRE with original
and innovative stage performance. Our
aim is to break with the traditional ideas of
a concert and engage with our audiences
in a barrier- free and welcoming way.

This has led us to create two bespoke programmes, **Under Construction** and **Wind**; two shows with stage direction, costume design, lighting, sound, video projections and choreography. Our combination of all these elements has allowed us to make our instrument known in an innovative way, as well as gaining a public following and attracting new classical music fans.

Windu has performed in MOSCOW, PRAGUE, LITHUANIA and throughout Spain. Recent highlights include appearances at the Santander International Festival, the Festival de Música Antigua de Úbeda y Baeza, Festival Antigua de Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Festival de Música de Puerto de la Cruz (Tenerife), the Sala La Gayarre del Teatro Real, the Auditorio Centro Centro and the Teatro Fernán Gómez (Madrid).



In the past year, Windu has premiered **¡Bailamos! Música y danzas de las noches españolas del Renacimiento** (Let's Dance! Music and Dances of Spanish Renaissance Nights), a concert-format show featuring the participation of a percussionist, which had its international debut in Lithuania. ***¡Bailamos!*** is a lively and interactive show designed to be performed in any space, as it does not require any technical resources to be staged.



But far from resting on our laurels, Windu has premiered **Winduvisión**, a new large-scale production designed for theaters and auditoriums, which debuted at the Eduard Toldrà Auditorium in Vilanova i la Geltrú. **Winduvisión** is a production featuring the most advanced technical and artistic team we've ever worked with and has received support from ICEC, the Department of Culture of the Generalitat of Catalonia. **Winduvisión** is the Windu show that definitively breaks the boundary between music and stage performance.

We don't just make music. We don't just make theatre.

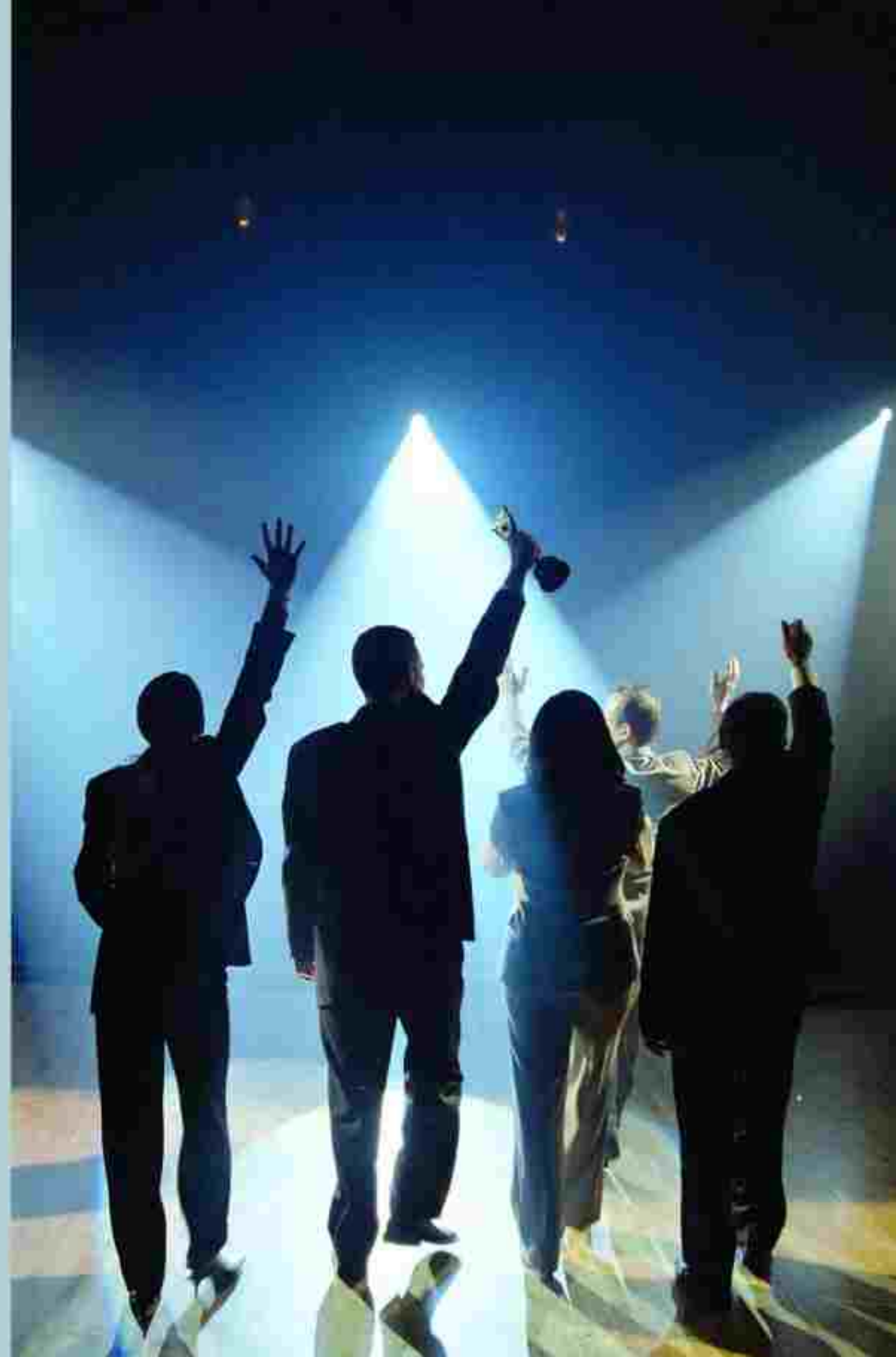



New show





Winduvision - Synopsis

Windu is an international recorder quartet that offers innovative performances, combining classical and contemporary music with touches of humor and absurd comedy. Their theatricalized concerts are suitable for all audiences and ages.

Winduvision is the title of an unfinished documentary about recorders, designed to bring old music to new audiences. When the director and crew abandon the project, the members of Windu decide to complete it during their performance, with the audience's help.

With conflicting ideas about the direction the film should take—playful, artistic, historical, or educational—Windu faces the question: Can a documentary from the National Recorder Association be as boring as a National Geographic one about penguins?



Halfway between a concert, a historical documentary, and a theatrical show, *Windu* offers a didactic and fun look at what would be the rise and fall of a pop group but transported to the world of classical music.

The beginnings of the *Windu* members, the relationship with their former teachers, the craftsmanship of the luthiers who make their instruments, achievements and failures, ego struggles, and a love story within the group, and the mafia-like and multimillion-dollar industry of recorders for primary schools are the ingredients of a deliberately misinformed documentary that will stir up the history of ancient music and the origins of this instrument.
